Breeding Gilt Show Regulations:

BREEDING GILT SHOW: Saturday, March 6, 2021 @ 8:00am

ALL gilts MUST be on premises by 8:00 a.m. Saturday morning.

OYE NOMINATION REQUIRED TO SHOW

1. Ownership: Each gilt must have been continuously owned and fed personally by the exhibitor since December 8, 2020.

2. Entering:

- a. All hog entries must include pseudo rabies papers and **premise ID**. A copy of pseudo rabies papers or validated herd certificate must be submitted for each exhibitor entry or one copy of a master pseudo rabies or validated herd certificate must be submitted with the club/chapter entry form
- b. All breeding gilts exhibited shall be individually identified with an OYE ear tag permanently affixed to the right ear, have a negative pseudo rabies test conducted after December 1st, and be identified on the test chart by said ear tag number.
- c. Purebred Gilt exhibitors will be called by breed to check Registration papers and turn in entry cards starting at 2:30 p.m. on Friday, March 5, 2021 and ending at 7.30 pm. Commercial Gilts official show ring card must be turned into the office with the final weight as determined by the exhibitor on Saturday, March 6, 2021 by 7:00 am.

3. Exhibition: Exhibitors may show four (4) breeding gilts. Barrows are not eligible for the gilt division. The following breeds will be shown: Berkshire, Chester, Duroc, Hampshire, Hereford, Landrace, Poland, Spot, Yorkshire, Crossbred.

- a. Pens will be assigned to each school according to the number of animals entered. Participants may choose to show swine out of a trailer. Trailers can in no way block driveways or the overhead doors to the building. Participants should be aware that they may be asked to move trailers by the show management. Failure to do so could result in disqualification.

- b. Promptness to the show ring is required. In order to keep the show moving, neither classes nor show order will wait on a participant to bring their animal to the ring. The Superintendent has the authority to disqualify an animal if they do not enter the ring in a timely manner.
- c. Minimum number of head guidelines: Breeds with 5 entries or less will show in one class.
- d. **Commercial Gilts:** Classes will be determined by weight.
 - i. Weight: All commercial gilts show weight will range from 210 to 340 pounds. All commercial gilts entered with estimated weight outside this range will be sifted. Any commercial gilt which weighs less than 210 pounds on show day will be sifted.
 - ii. Commercial gilts will be split by color and shown separately as light cross and dark cross. See qualifications below. If the gilt classes out of the light crosses, they may show as a dark cross.

Light Cross Commercial Gilts – Commercial gilts with only white, blue, rusty, sandy, and gray pigmentation. No gilts with black and/or red pigmentation (including black or red belted, black and/or red patched, or spotted) on 20% or more of the total body area will be allowed to show in the light crossbred division.

Dark Cross Commercial Gilts – There is no qualification for the dark crossbred gilt division. This division is primarily for those gilts with black and/or red pigmentation on 20% or more of the total body area. However, a gilt of ANY color or breed may show in this division.

- e. **Purebred Registered Gilts:** Classes will be determined by age. Purebred gilts born between July 1 and September 30 are eligible to show. Commercial gilts will show by weight.
 - i. **Registration Papers:** Official registration papers are required. Applications, faxed copies and pending documents are not acceptable forms. All pedigrees must be officially transferred into the exhibitor's name by the respective breed association. An exhibitor may exhibit an animal registered in the name of a fellow exhibitor as described in the household nomination rule.

NOTE: *Pedigrees that are simply signed on the back by the respective breeder and not officially transferred into the exhibitor's name by the breed association will not be accepted.*

4. Grooming: Water will be the only substance permitted for coat dressing. Oil is not allowed. All exhibits will be checked as they enter the sift pen. Clipping is allowed in the barns; however, no snaring will be allowed.

10. Premium Sale: There will be three (3) breeding gilts sold in the premium sale. The supreme, reserve supreme and bronze medallion gilts will be eligible. For the purpose of duplicated winners, alternates may be selected.

11. General Rules: Review the General Rules and Regulations for all exhibitors and animals listed elsewhere in this publication. These rules and regulations will apply in the Gilt Show.

Market Barrow Show Regulations:

ALL barrows MUST on premises by 8:00 a.m. Sunday morning.

OYE NOMINATION REQUIRED TO SHOW

1. Ownership: Each barrow must have been continuously owned and fed personally by the exhibitor since December 8, 2020.

2. Entering:

- a. All hog entries must include pseudo rabies papers and **premise ID**. A copy of pseudo rabies papers or validated herd certificate must be submitted for each exhibitor entry or one copy of a master pseudo rabies or validated herd certificate must be submitted with the club/chapter entry form.
- b. All market barrows exhibited shall be individually identified with an OYE ear tag permanently affixed, have a negative pseudo rabies test conducted after December 1st, and be identified on the test chart by said ear tag number.
- c. The official show ring card must be turned into the Swine Superintendent's office with the final weight as determined by the exhibitor on Saturday, March 6, 2021 by 7:30 p.m.

3. Exhibition: Exhibitors may show four (4) market barrows. Gilts are not eligible for the market barrow division. The following breeds will be shown: Berkshire, Chester, Duroc, Hampshire, Hereford, Poland, Spot, Yorkshire, Crossbred.

- a. Pens will be assigned to each school according to the number of animals entered. Participants may choose to show swine out of a trailer. Trailers can in no way block driveways or the overhead doors to the building. Participants should be aware that they may be asked to move trailers by the show management. Failure to do so could result in disqualification.
- b. Promptness to the show ring is required. In order to keep the show moving, neither classes nor show order will wait on a participant to bring their animal to the ring. The Superintendent has the authority to disqualify an animal if they do not enter the ring in a timely manner.

- c. Crossbreds will be split by color and shown separately as light cross and dark cross. See qualifications below. If the barrow classifies out of the light crosses, they may show as a dark cross.

Light Cross – Crossbred barrows with only white, blue, rusty, sandy, and gray pigmentation. No barrows with black and/or red pigmentation (including black or red belted, black and/or red patched, or spotted) on 20% or more of the total body area will be allowed to show in the light crossbred division.

Dark Cross – There is no qualification for the dark crossbred division. This division is primarily for those crossbred barrows with black and/or red pigmentation on 20% or more of the total body area. However, a barrow of ANY color or breed may show in this division

4. Weight: Show weight will range from 210 to 280 pounds. All barrows entered with estimated weight outside this range will be sifted. Any barrow which weighs less than 210 pounds on show day will be sifted.

5. Weigh Back: At least the top five (5) animals in each class will be weighed. Those weighing more than ten (10) pounds above the official estimated weight will be eliminated from the show. If swine weighs out on official scale #1, a reweigh will be granted on official scale #2. Only one attempt per scale will be granted.

6. Classification: Swine will be classified as they enter the show ring. All swine in purebred classes must have healed ear notches on both ears. Purebred barrows that are classified out of a purebred class will have the option of showing in the dark crossbred class with the corresponding weight.

7. Grooming: Water will be the only substance permitted for coat dressing. Oil is not allowed. All exhibits will be checked as they enter the sift pen. Clipping is allowed in the barns; however, no snaring will be allowed.

8. Premium Sale:

- a. For barrow breeds with 10 head or more shown, champions are guaranteed a spot in the sale.
- b. For barrow breeds with less than 10 head shown, champions are NOT guaranteed a spot in the sale. Sale order for these breeds will be selected by quality order as determined by the swine judge.

9. Testing: All barrows are subject to be tested for unauthorized compounds.

10. General Rules: Review the General Rules and Regulations for all exhibitors and animals listed elsewhere in this publication. These rules will apply in the Barrow Show.
